Celebrating 38 years of our

Nutcracker

A message from Pia Bouman



Quite a long time ago, in the time of our great-great grandparents, there was a girl name Clara. She lived in a big house in an old town in Germany, with her parents, and her brother Fritz... and here is where our story begins.

Over the years, our production has not changed much in concept: Act 1, with its open stage invites each audience member to be part of the party, the curtain closes on the final scene of Snow... and Act 2 begins in front of the closed curtain: it is a different world, a different reality and we find ourselves privileged to watch.

The first performance took place in 1985, in the Parish Hall of Our Lady of Lebanon on Queen Street in the heart of Parkdale. There were 50 dancers. In time, the number of young performers grew sometimes to 100 dancers. The guiding principal for who would have a role in our Nutcracker has never changed: if you auditioned, there would be a role for you... Thus, new roles were invented: 'Uncle Drosselmeyer's Nephew' appeared to disappear again, Mere Gigogne became two roles, when Pere Gigogne made an entrance, but



eventually both made room for the amazing Court Jester, today a much coveted role. The acrobats became Students of Jest. And there is the Chef of Magnificent Pastries with her bakers. Names of dances changed too: the Arabian dance became the Dance of the Desert, the Chinese Dance now is for the Lotus Princess...

The 2023 cast is still small compared to pre-Covid times, and our dancers, aged 7 - 17 courageously have taken on more roles than is normal. Our senior dancers took two or even three lead roles, and have helped re-establishing the love and passion for the process that leads up to the performances: several of the younger dancers never experienced what it means to be part of this amazing Nutcracker journey.

The dance of the Volunteers, is the dance performed by a valiant group of Nutcracker volunteers who tirelessly worked on costume repair and planning and today assist in getting all performers 'stage-ready'. In the lobby you will see more volunteers taking care of the boutique, flower shop and the bake table.

Since the first performance in 1985, we missed only one year: the 35th Nutcracker in 2020, cancelled because of the Covid 19 pandemic. Still in the grip of Covid, the 36th was a very intimate show performed at our studio theatre for a "Covid-safe" audience number of 70. Live streamed, it still reached a larger audience. The 37th Nutcracker brought us back to Humberside Collegiate Institute and today we proudly dance the 38th Nutcracker. We have such a long history!

Our story is firmly based on the classic tale by E.T.A. Hoffman and it has become

a yearly tradition not only for our families, friends and alumni, but for many Torontonians and visitors. Our story is welcoming and family friendly.

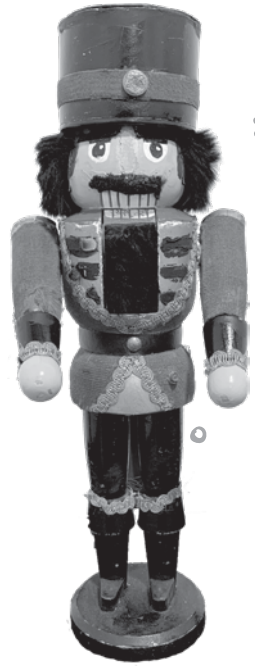

Nutcracker: The Traditional Story

Act 1 The beginning:

The household staff of the Stahlbaum family is making sure the house is ready for the arrival of the guests for the annual Christmas party. The food is all prepared, the maids investigate the usefulness of the new cleaning machine purchased by Butler Brown. Mrs. Flöde, the Housekeeper, does not approve of the expense... Clara sits quietly by the beautifully decorated tree.

Scene 1: The party

Mama and papa Stahlbaum enter with Fritz, all are excited as they welcome the guests. The Christmas tree is lit... and the dancing begins: a cotillion march for all the young guests, then the fun "clapping gallop is interrupted by Butler Brown and Mrs. Flöde who bring in glasses of wine for the Christmas toast. An exciting polka is joined by all and then... Uncle Drosselmeyer stops the merriment: he has brought the presents for the children: beautiful dolls, hobbyhorses, and for Clara... a strange wooden Nutcracker, not even new...After the amazing display of the wind-up dolls, and some more dancing, Clara dances with her Nutcracker... Fritz, not given a chance to touch it gets angry and breaks it. The boys get tired and rambunctious, and tease the girls by stealing their dolls. Papa Stahlbaum decides it is time for the last dance of the evening and after a final promenade all go home...

Act 1, Scene 2

Clara cannot sleep and decides to go back to the ballroom to get the Nutcracker, left by Uncle Drosselmeyer by the Christmas tree. Several little mice scare her, but it is when the evil Mouse King tries to snatch the Nutcracker out of her arms that she begins to understand that the gift of Uncle Drosselmeyer is much more than just a wooden Nutcracker. The Mouse King leaps into hiding. The Nutcracker appears suddenly, larger than life... the Christmas tree grows to a great height and the Mouse King issues the challenge: a battle to death. The Wind-up Dolls and some of Fritz's toy soldiers march in to help on the side of the Nutcracker. Fierce mice are part of the Mouse King's his evil plan. When all seems nearly lost, Clara finds the ultimate courage and slays the Mouse King.

And then again the dance spreads its power to the fathers and mothers of the dancers such as Mike Crawley, Dylan Parker, Jessie Quach, Gina Vanni, and Lilja Palsson who learned about props and set building and who embraced the notion that our Nutcracker is - in a nutshell - a metaphor for life. And that's why alumni return.

It is when we embrace life that we dance... with grace, with belief, with dedication. And make it a gift, the gift of our creation to you!
